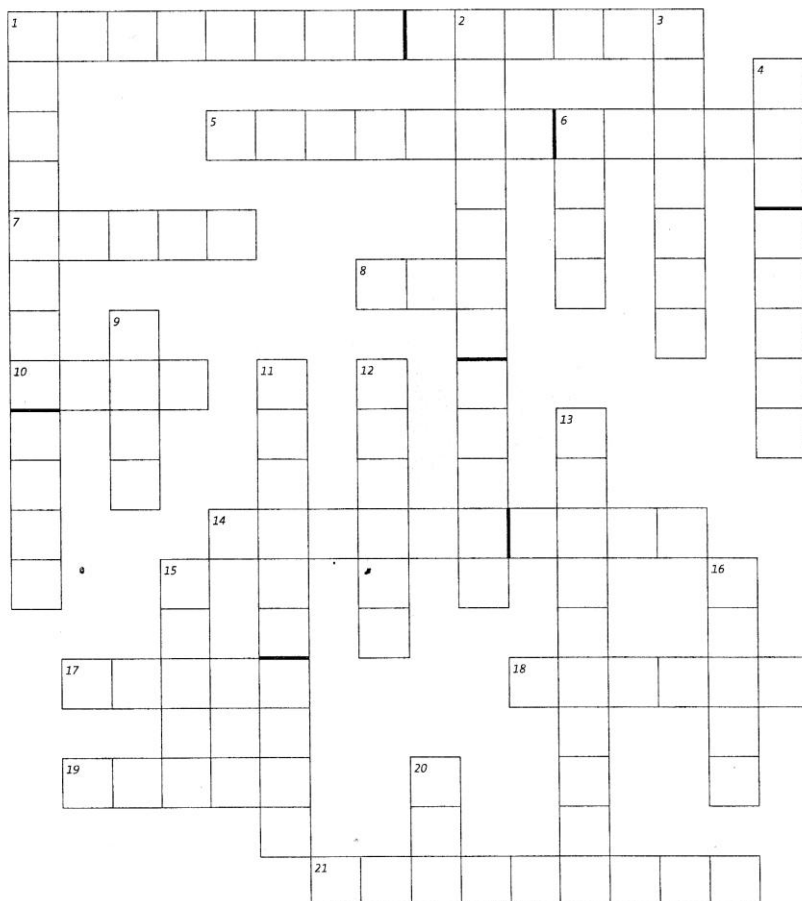

Are you football crazy?



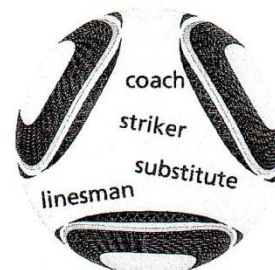
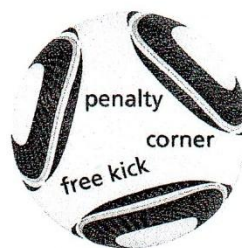
